

A2 Greek Unseen Verse (Sophocles) Past Paper: AQA 1994 (A messenger brings news of Heracles return to Deianeira)

A messenger tells Deianeira that her husband, Heracles, will soon be home from the war. He has run ahead of the herald, Lichus, eager to be the first to bring her the news.

Sophocles: *Trachiniae* 180–191

τὸν...Ἀλκμήνης τόκον (line 2): Heracles was the son of Alcmena.
ἐπίστω (line 3): 2nd person singular imperative of ἐπίσταμαι.
