Translate the following passage into English. Write your translation on alternate lines.

The consul Fabius has sent envoys to try to persuade the neighbouring Aequi to make peace, promising them clemency; but the Aequi, rejecting the offer in favour of war, are defeated twice, firstly by Fabius and then by the other consul, Quinctius.

So far were Fabius' words from having the slightest effect on the Aequi that the envoys narrowly escaped violation, and an army was dispatched to the town of Algidus against the Romans.
